Q&A: What Did Jesus Mean When He Said, "I Am the Way"?

An invitation to hope, peace, and purpose

When Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6), He wasn't issuing a challenge or building walls - He was **opening a door.**
